Mission

Vision

By providing an engaging and meaningful learning environment, we will foster a child's natural curiosity and desire to learn. We will focus on student achievement while embracing social emotional learning, critical thinking, international-mindedness, and reflection, to prepare students for success in college and their chosen careers.

School Goals

Goal #1 (Math): Student achievement in Math in grades 3rd-6th will increase, with the percent of students meeting grade level standards increasing from G5% as measured on the 2019 SBAC to 70% on the 2021 SBAC administered in May 2021.

Goal #2 (ELA): Student achievement in ELA in grades 3rd-Gth will increase, with the percent of students meeting grade level standards increasing from 75% as measured on the 2019 SBAC to 78% on the 2021 SBAC administered in May 2021.

Goal #3 (Culture & Climate): Maintain 93% positive school culture for all students as measured by overall positive responses from the 2020 School Climate Survey to the 2021 School Climate Survey.

- ELA, History/Social Studies and Science Standards integrated with transdisciplinary IB PYP Units

- GATE: Embedded in IB PYP Units through inquiry and differentiated instruction

Gifted + Talented Services

What's the difference between IB Primary Years Program & GATE Designated Services?

IB Primary Years Program	GATE Designated Services
Open to students of all abilities and interests from across SCUSD.	GATE Centers: Classes form a cohort for grades 2-6; at least 75% of class is GATE identified. GATE Clusters: Classes have approximately six GATE identified students and a mix of students from the general education population.
Teachers receive extensive training and support in IB protocols and educational practices.	Teachers are GATE Certificated and receive ongoing training in Gifted Education practices and the needs of GATE students.
Curriculum and content are transdisciplinary and differentiated by design. Student choice and inquiry drive differentiation. Language arts, science and social studies are examined under central conceptual ideas, with integrated arts and second language.	Curriculum is differentiated according to student readiness and interest in the primary content areas. Units of study may offer opportunities for acceleration, increased depth & complexity, and options for student choice.
High levels of collaborative work and student- centered inquiry and instruction with emphasis on constructivist theory and critical thinking.	Students are flexibly grouped according to interest, readiness, and learning style for collaboration. Emphasis on acceleration, novelty, depth & complexity.
Program of Inquiry collaboratively developed on site, across grade levels, and aligned K-6; approved by International Baccalaureate Organization.	Curriculum units designed using Iconic Prompts of Depth and Complexity, Thinking like a Disciplinarian and teaching models from the College of William and Mary.
Social-Emotional Learning, whole child, and personal development emphasized through the IB Learner Profile and Action Cycle.	GATE Certified teachers receive on-going professional learning about the needs of GATE students including issues about underachievement, perfectionism, 2E, and overexcitabilities.
